HOKKAIDO

World-Class Powder Snow, Sea Urchin

The prefecture is a popular destination for skiing and snowboarding thanks to its abundant powder snow. Uni (sea urchin) from here is rich and deep with an elegant sweetness that cannot be matched.

YAMAGATA

Samurai Land, Wagyu

Known as the "Ginjo Kingdom", Yamagata produces a high ratio of ginjo-shu that is famous for its high quality. Sake brewing has flourished for a long time, and some breweries have been in business for over 400 years.

NIIGATA

Hot Springs, High Quality Rice

Japan's leading producer of rice, the pinnacle of which is the coveted strain of "koshihikari", and is also a prominent hub for sake and seafood. This prefecture's light, crisp, and dry sakes are known as a "Tanrei Karakuchi" taste profile.

ISHIKAWA

Big Fish Market, Onsen

Many of the reputed breweries in this prefecture are putting special emphasis on the yamahai-zukuri method. The profound acidity of the yamahai with the deep umami makes a full-bodied sake that is highly rated by sake lovers.

FUKUI

Echizen Kani, Great Water

Its crystal waters are acclaimed as some of the best water in Japan. This prefecture has the perfect environment, alongside the intense cold and deep snow in the winter.

HIROSHIMA

Oysters, Lemons

The birthplace of ginjo brewing. Hiroshima is also known as home to the largest oyster beds in Japan, as well as beautiful lemon trees.

TOKYO

KANAGAWA

Surf Town, Shirasu, Big Buddha

This prefecture is known for its beautiful coastline and surfer culture. It is also the birthplace of the famous Japanese woodblock art "The Great Wave."

KYOTO

Birthplace of Sake, Fushimi Water

Kyoto is known for being the birthplace of sake and ranks No. 2 in sake production. These sakes are characterized by their soft, smooth taste made from soft to medium hard water.

OSAKA

Nightlife, Street Food

What differentiates Osaka from other prefectures in Japan is the more laid-back, relaxed city vibe, with a focus on food and entertainment. Often called the "nation's kitchen," it is known as the food capital of Japan.

KAGAWA

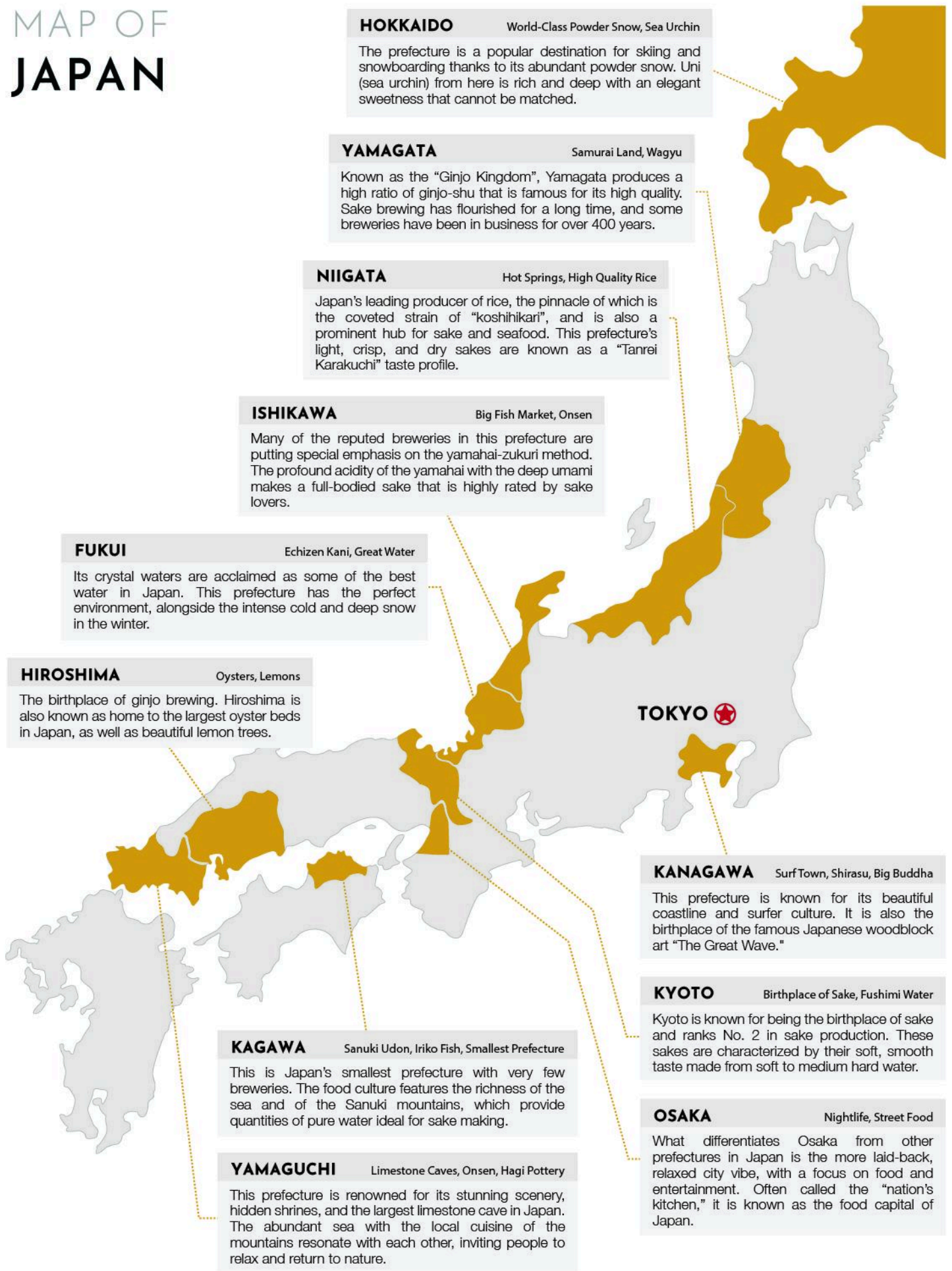
Sanuki Udon, Iriko Fish, Smallest Prefecture

This is Japan's smallest prefecture with very few breweries. The food culture features the richness of the sea and of the Sanuki mountains, which provide quantities of pure water ideal for sake making.

YAMAGUCHI

Limestone Caves, Onsen, Hagi Pottery

This prefecture is renowned for its stunning scenery, hidden shrines, and the largest limestone cave in Japan. The abundant sea with the local cuisine of the mountains resonate with each other, inviting people to relax and return to nature.

Tokubetsu Honjozo, Kanagawa Prefecture

Tensei is inspired by Kanagawa’s beautiful coastline and surfer culture. Enjoy the feel of a perfect endless summer with this bright, refreshing taste of Kanagawa. Bright and fresh sake with a salted melon finish.

Takahiro “Noble Arrow”

Tokubetsu Junmai, Yamaguchi Prefecture

The limestone covered mountains nearby give this sake a rich mineral driven structure packed with tension and pronounced acidity. A timeless style of sake that old-world wine drinkers easily gravitate to. Creamy, luxurious mid palate with a spearmint-driven herbal finish.

Tosatsuru Azure

Ginjo, Kochi Prefecture

This sake uses deep-sea water off the Kochi Prefecture coast for brewing. After a great deal of testing, the brewers were able to use powerful fermentation of the seawater to get a ginjo that is sharp and refreshing. It boasts the traditional ginjo aroma and a very clean, low mineral flavor.

Fukucho “Forgotten Fortune”

Junmai, Hiroshima Prefecture

There are around 30 female tojis in Japan, but when Miho-san started brewing there were far fewer. Her extreme dedication to her craft encourages the future of women in this industry. Miho-san revived Hattanso rice, an extinct heirloom breed, by devoting over 10 years of her life to learning how to grow it and brew with it. Full flavor, earthy touches, and great texture with a long, persistent finish.

Tozai “Well of Wisdom”

12 34

Ginjo, Kyoto Prefecture

Be transported to Japan just by looking at Tozai—the labels feature hand-painted koi fish, traditional Japanese kanji, and origami paper patterns. Well of Wisdom draws its water source from the town of Fushimi, which means “hidden water” and is known for its characteristically soft and pure water. Soft and silky with a touch of white pepper on the finish.

Kawatsuru “Crane of Paradise”

Junmai, Kagawa Prefecture

Known for its rice-driven style with elegant, rich texture, Kawatsuru pays respect to the crane that symbolizes longevity and good fortune. Crane of Paradise is described as “umakuchi,” a combination between sweet, dry and umami flavors. Juicy notes of grapefruit and freshly cut grass, with a hint of salted pineapple.

Yuhu “Eternal Embers”

Junmai, Ishikawa Prefecture

President Miho Fujita, a single career woman from Tokyo with no prior knowledge of sake, and Toji Yokomichi-san, do not follow traditional brewing methods—they brew the sake they enjoy drinking. Yuhu means “happy rice” and also refers to the city’s supposed numerous UFO sightings. Bread pudding aromatics of raisin, nut and fig.

Mana 1751 “True Vision”

Yamahai Tokubetsu Junmai, Fukui Prefecture

This sake embraces a truly purist philosophy; undiluted, unfiltered, unblended, pure rice sake made in the risky and labor intensive ancient yamahai method. This is a true microbrewery; with three total employees making 200 koku annually. An aromatic and expressive yamahai with notes of tart yogurt, mushroom, honey, banana and steamed rice. Try this one warm for more umami flavors.

Junmai Daiginjo, Yamagata Prefecture

The purity of the region of Yamagata shines in this sake, with the crispness of their pristine water, the grassy, spicy quality of dewasansan rice, and the opulent textures derived from shizuku free run finishing. Current president Kenichiro Kojima is the 24th generation of the legendary Kojima family. Refreshing and pure with notes of pineapple, white peach, green apple, lily, and a hint of white pepper.

Wakatake Onikoroshi “Demon Slayer”

Junmai Daiginjo, Shizuoka Prefecture

A semi-fruity brew with a unique dryness that speaks to wine drinkers. This elegant Junmai Daiginjo has a delicate aroma of ripe fruits, velvety texture, and finishes on a sharp, crisp note.

Daimon “Road to Osaka”

13 35

Tokubetsu Junmai Nigori, Osaka Prefecture

This cloudy “nigori” sake will transport you to Osaka and the Daimon brewery where they have been crafting fresh, lively sake for six generations. Brewery president and toji, Yasutaka Daimon, is a 6th generation brewer who is also a jazz musician. Daimon-san often listens to jazz while making sake, believing that both jazz and sake go together hand in hand. A creamy & mild nigori with notes of banana, citrus and floral.

Yamayuzu “Mountain Yuzu”

Yuzu-Infused, Junmai, Kochi Prefecture

This sake delivers a delightful dash of citrus with its 10% yuzu juice. The yuzu’s enlivening aroma and vibrant acidity bring a pleasant citrus kick without any bitterness. This is done through a combination of straining to remove the bitter oil from the yuzu, and a low-temperature pasteurization method usually used for high-end sake.

The Whiskys of Suntory — Yamazaki

Founded in 1923 by Shinjiro Torii, the Yamazaki Distillery is Japan's first and oldest malt whisky distillery. Yamazaki is not only the soul place of Suntory Whisky but the birthplace of Japanese whisky. Inspired by traditional Scottish whisky, it is said that Torii selected the land of Yamazaki at the foot of Mt. Tennozan for its high-quality water source and natural environment ideal for whisky making. Nestled proudly on the periphery of Kyoto, the area around Yamazaki Distillery has been long referred to as "Minaseno" famous for its exquisite natural water.

The Mizunara cask is a perfect expression of "Tsukuriwake" – the art of diversity in whisky making. Diverse grain types, as well as fermentation, distillation and maturation techniques, underpin Suntory's legendary Art of Blending.

For Suntory's Chief Blender Shinji Fukuyo, every creation is a new journey to achieve the exquisite balance of subtlety, refinement and complexity that is the hallmark of all Suntory whiskies. In his pursuit of true "Mizunara-ness," he tasted hundreds of Mizunara whiskies and made selections with varying ages, from 18 years old and beyond. A small portion exceeds even 50 years of maturation, which gives this limited edition an incomparable depth and flavor that lingers long after the liquid has passed the lips.

It is said that in the early 1940s, Suntory's blenders began small scale experiments with Mizunara. But it wasn't until the end of World War II, when it became difficult to import wood, that Suntory truly focused on mastering the homegrown Mizunara cask. Although only found in a few regions within Japan, it wasn't Mizunara's rarity that presented the greatest challenge to cask makers. It was the hard, permeable nature of the wood. The name Mizunara comes from the tree's high moisture content – in Japanese "mizu" means water and "nara" means oak. Its permeable character is less than ideal for cask making since liquid can easily seep through the wood. And because Mizunara is a hardwood, it can be difficult to shape and join with the precision needed to prevent leaks.

Through great perseverance, Suntory's craftsmen mastered the art of Mizunara cask-making by learning how to identify the right trees to make the finest casks. Suntory's cask makers found that, although more rare, straight grain trees are less permeable. Trees suitable for cask making must have grown perfectly straight and have a diameter of at least 27.5 inches. They also tend to be far older than trees used in other casks. In keeping with Suntory's deep respect for the environment, trees are only cut if their removal will not jeopardize the health of the forest.

Throughout their long history using Mizunara casks, Suntory's blenders have observed that age is the key to unlocking the signature taste of Mizunara whisky. A long maturation period reveals the distinctive spiciness and incense-like flavor of sandalwood and aloe wood that Suntory considers the quintessential "Mizunara-ness." With other cask types, whisky usually reaches a maturation peak at some point. But even after maturing 50 years and beyond, Mizunara whiskies are still improving. This unique ability to support long-term aging affords endless opportunities to experience the evolution and refinement of Mizunara whiskies over time.

The Whiskys of Suntory — Hakushu

The Hakushu Distillery was founded half a century after Yamazaki. Keizo Saji, the second Master Blender, inherited his father's quest to push the boundaries of what a Japanese whisky could be. He had searched all over Japan for high quality water that would produce the most delicately aromatic whisky. After searching with tenacity to the headstreams of rivers and deep into rugged mountains, he found Hakushu. The Hakushu Distillery is one of the highest distilleries in the world, built amidst the deepest forests of Mt. Kaikoma-gatake in the Japanese Southern Alps. The malt whiskies that are born here are simultaneously blessed with a very particular microclimate, verdant forests, and water offering a rare softness and purity, made possible only by filtration of rain and snow through thousand-year-old granite rocks.

Keizo Saji and his team took on the challenge of working with peat for Hakushu. "Peated" is a term most often associated with Scotch whiskies. The island of Islay in particular, is renowned for the tradition of smoky whiskies that feature heavy peat flavors. But for Hakushu, peated means something special. Hakushu brings a subtly smoky Japanese single malt, soft and sweet, made from the House of Suntory's "Mountain Forest Distillery," nestled deep in the Japanese Southern Alps. A new interpretation of "peated whisky" that serves as a tribute to all Hakushu fans. Refined and elegant, this centennial Hakushu of 100% Peated Malts brings a new angle to peated whisky—an expression the House of Suntory lovingly refers to as "Japanese smoke." The smoke here is less pungent, never dominant and like all things Japanese, more complex and gentle. The result is a spicy, peppery welcome, with a slow wave of smoke that deepens as it reveals its herbaceous notes and green fruity undertones.

The Whiskys of Nikka — Yoichi

Masataka Taketsuru was born into a sake brewing family in Hiroshima and is the first distiller of Japanese whisky. He began his career as the Master distiller of Yamazaki distillery and was the first Japanese apprentice of whisky in Scotland. He learned the craft of making great whisky in Speyside at Longmorn distillery. Yoichi, the place chosen by Masataka as his first distillery, was close to the sea, surrounded by mountains on three sides and in many ways, like Highland in Scotland. Masataka valued the climate and natural features of the north as the proximity to the sea is one of the distinctive features of Yoichi. The sea breeze gives a briny hint to the whisky during the maturation. To this day, the distillation process at Yoichi has remained very traditional and is still known for producing bold and powerful whiskies.

The Whiskys of Nikka — Miyagikyo

Masataka aimed to make his blend more complex by widening the variety of whiskies. In 1967 he was exploring the northern part of the main island to find another ideal site for his second distillery. He came across a beautiful foggy glen surrounded by mountains and at a junction of two clean rivers. Once he tried the water from one of the rivers, which is now the water source for Miyagikyo distillery, he was impressed and immediately decided to build a distillery there. By coincidence, the name of the river was Nikkawa.

Masataka aimed to develop a complete contrast between Yoichi Distillery and Miyagikyo Distillery. Along with the different terroir, the unique distillation method of Miyagikyo creates distinctive malt whiskies. Pot stills are heated by indirect steam at a much lower temperature that allows slower distillation. This method, along with other contrasting distillation techniques and technology, results in the soft and floral characteristics Miyagikyo is known for.

The Whiskys of Nikka — The Marriage of Two Distilleries

Nikka “Taketsuru” Pure Malt and Nikka “From the Barrel” are a marriage of whiskies distilled at both Yoichi and Miyagikyo Distilleries. Nikka “From the Barrel” is a blended whisky which was released in 1985. The development of this expression started with an aim to deliver full flavors and richness of whisky like “from the barrel” which only blenders can sniff and taste. The secret behind its gorgeous flavor is the unique combination of complex blending, higher ABV 51.4% and “marriage” process.

Nikka “Taketsuru” Pure Malt Whisky is a signature label in honor of Nikka’s founder Masataka Taketsuru, the first Japanese craftsman who mastered whisky-making in Scotland and brought his expertise back to Japan. While being a disciplined distiller, he was also a person of curiosity and open-mindedness. This is a tribute to Masataka from his successors, highlighting a perfect balance with complexity achieved by precise blending inherited from the founder.

Once the single malts from Yoichi and Miyagikyo have been distilled for “Taketsuru” Pure Malt, they are aged for an average of 10 years in various types of oak casks before being vatted together to create the final blend. As a result of this vating, this pure malt has a soft, floral aroma, with notes of green fruits, papaya, lemon, and brown sugar. The finish is full-bodied and lush, with hints of cocoa, peat, and oak.

Located between Japan’s soaring Southern Alps and Central Alps at just over 2,600 feet, Mars Shinshu is Japan’s highest whisky distillery. The Hombo family have been distilling for more than a century. Until 1984, it was the southernmost whisky made in Japan, which ended when the Hombo clan moved the distillery to the idyllic alpine setting of Miyada village in southern Nagano Prefecture, Central Japan. They chose this site for its cool temperature, which slowed maturation, and the plentiful granite-filtered, snowmelt-fed aquifers. A beautiful choice for creating whiskies that are elegant, sophisticated, and very complex. In 2016, Hombo Shuzo reopened and introduced new pot stills to their first distillery location in Kagoshima. They also built an aging facility on a tiny island known as Yakushima, a National World Heritage site, where they now age spirits from both Shinshu and Tsunuki distilleries.

KOMAGATAKE SERIES

Keizo Saji and his team took on the challenge of working with peat for Hakushu. “Peated” is a term most often associated with Scotch whiskies. The island of Islay in particular, is renowned for the tradition of smoky whiskies that feature heavy peat flavors. But for Hakushu, peated means something special. Hakushu brings a subtly smoky Japanese single malt, soft and sweet, made from the House of Suntory’s “Mountain Forest Distillery,” nestled deep in the Japanese Southern Alps. A new interpretation of “peated whisky” that serves as a tribute to all Hakushu fans. Refined and elegant, this centennial Hakushu of 100% Peated Malts brings a new angle to peated whisky—an expression the House of Suntory lovingly refers to as “Japanese smoke.” The smoke here is less pungent, never dominant and like all things Japanese, more complex and gentle. The result is a spicy, peppery welcome, with a slow wave of smoke that deepens as it reveals its herbaceous notes and green fruity undertones.

KOMAGATAKE X CHICHIBU

An unparalleled collaboration between two of Japan’s most iconic whisky distilleries, Mars Shinshu & Chichibu. With the pursuit of new possibilities in mind, pot still “new make” was exchanged by each distillery in April 2015. Unlike in Scotland where trading distillate is common practice, this was a first in the hundred-year history of Japanese whisky production.

The environment around Chichibu distillery is rich in nature, benefitting heavily by the Arakawa River and a vast range of temperatures this natural basin provides, while Mars Shinshu distillery is at high elevation, surrounded by a beautiful forest rich with butterflies and wildlife at the foot of Mt. Komagatake in the Japanese Central Alps.

Malt Duo is a blend of 5+ year old Ichiro’s Malt distilled in Chichibu yet aged at Mars Shinshu distillery and Mars Komagatake that has also been aged 5+ years. Maturation took place in ex-bourbon, sherry, & American White Oak casks.

The Whiskys of Mars — Mars Tsunuki

Hombo Shuzo deliberately chose Minamisatsuma City in Kagoshima for their second distillery because its climate is so different from that of Mars Shinshu. In contrast to the colder mountain elevations of the Shinshu region, Tsunuki follows the global trend of making and maturing whisky in warmer climates like Taiwan, Texas, and Australia. Mars Tsunuki malts are rich and robust compared to the light and clean style associated with Mars Shinshu malts. This is a stated goal of the distillery, as having two significantly different styles of whisky in their portfolio allows for better blending and diversity.

The Tsunuki Distillery you see today is not made up of the original buildings it once was. Given its proximity to Chiran, from which kamikaze sorties were launched towards the end of WW2, the distillery supplied the war effort and was thus a target of Allied bombing. Even though the distillery was annihilated in 1945, Mars recovered quite quickly, with a new distillery building in place by 1947.

Notably, there are only a handful of malt whisky makers in Japan that have two distilleries with significant distance between them: Suntory (Yamazaki and Hakushu), Nikka (Yoichi and Miyagikyo), and now Mars (Shinshu and Tsunuki). Of those, Mars' whisky distilleries are the furthest apart geographically.

THE YAKUSHIMA AGING CELLAR

The Y.A. line, which stands for "Yakushima Aging" explores the humid subtropical climate of Yakushima Island. Yakushima is a fabled location off the southern coast of Japan and is a World Natural Heritage site—a forested and hilly island located about 60 km southwest of mainland Kagoshima. This special island enjoys a humid subtropical climate with mild winters and hot summers and is generally rain-soaked all year round. This significantly intensifies the cask interaction with the distillate, while allowing it to mature for longer periods of time, creating a more intensely flavored whisky with unique maritime sea salt notes.

The Whiskys of Venture Chichibu

Risen from the ashes of the legendary Hanyu Distillery, Chichibu was established in 2004 by master distiller and blender Ichiro Akuto and at the time was Japan's first independent distillery to open in over three decades. It all started some three centuries ago when the first of Ichiro Akuto's forefathers began making alcoholic beverages in Saitama Prefecture. His Grandfather began making whisky in the mid 1940's with Hanyu Distillery, whose focus on malt whiskies took off with the Japanese economic boom of the 1980's. However, when the bubble burst in the 1990's, so too did the first Japanese Whisky boom, leading Hanyu distillery and many others to close their doors indefinitely. Thankfully, Ichiro Akuto, grandson of the distillery's founder, was not ready to see over 20 years' worth of his family's hard work go to waste and so, with financial backing from Sasanokawa Shuzo, he purchased all the remaining casks. These casks would go on to become some of the rarest and most sought-after Japanese whisky releases of all time, including the record-breaking "Playing Card Series" that is now legendary with individual bottles being considered the unicorns of the Japanese whisky world.

With this success Ichiro saw that the revival of artisan Japanese whisky was imminent and opened his own distillery in the beautiful Chichibu region two hours west of Tokyo. Uniquely, Chichibu Distillery also built its own cooperage and floor malting facility on site, anomalies by any measured distillery standard. The distillery is the only in the world to use 100% Mizunara Japanese oak washbacks, which creates the distinctly fruitier Ichiro's Malt style of whisky. All of this coupled with continuous evaluation by nose and tasting daily rather than timed measurements adds to the illustrious status of this small yet impactful distillery.

Komagatake distillery, nestled in the Japanese Alps, has its own rich history and is known for producing whiskies with a distinct character and regional influence.

What sets this release apart is not only its exceptional flavor profile, but also the story it tells. This rare whisky represents the spirit of collaboration and the willingness to push boundaries in the pursuit of excellence. It is a testament to the creativity and innovation that drives the Japanese whisky industry forward. The Whiskies of Kaiyo

OCEAN MATURED — It is centuries' old knowledge that the amalgamation of the salt ocean air and a distant sea voyage enriches whisky. To further enhance Kaiyo whisky, it too, embarks on its own journey through the seas from Osaka Japan which lasts up to three months. The result of the sea voyage and maturation is Kaiyo's distinct chronicle of its journey, a diary, into its depths. Just as no two stories are identical, neither is each sea voyage with factors including the motion of the sea waves, temperature changes, and variations of weather and air pressure all contributing to the aging effects. This produces an inimitable kismet between spirit and mizunara oak casks resulting in an intricately exquisite finish.

MOVEMENT — A distinct and extraordinary aging effect is infused into Kaiyo's whisky as a result of the sea maturation. Throughout the journey, the whisky dances within the cask from the ebb and flow of the sea waves, ensuring every drop of it to be in perpetual contact with the mizunara oak.

TEMPERATURE VARIATION — The aging effect of whisky is the result of a chemical reaction; heat is a natural catalyst in a chemical reaction. While on its sea maturation journey, the whisky is subject to variations of temperature. For an extensive period of the journey, the whisky is exposed to warm climates, providing higher temperatures, thereby accelerating the aging process.

AIR PRESSURE CHANGES — While at sea, the whisky experiences frequent alterations of air pressure allowing the mizunara oak to contract and expand, varying the levels of oxygen at given times and beckoning the mizunara oak to release its delicate flavors and aromas.

The Whiskies of Kujira

Kujira, meaning "whale" in Japanese, is a symbol of liberty, generosity, and peace. The largest creature in the natural world and abundant in the Pacific Ocean surrounding the islands, the whale is considered the guardian of tranquility and nature to the people of Ryukyu and Okinawa.

Pioneer of a new kind of whisky, Kujira innovated in grain whiskies by using a cereal that had never been used for whisky before and more traditionally associated with other spirits from Japan. Founded in 1952, the Kumesen Syuzo Company began distilling spirits made from long grain Indica rice and fermented with native black koji, a unique koji that can only be found in Okinawa. These grain whiskies made from rice, also called "Ryukyu" whiskies, draw their roots from the production of Awamori, Okinawa's ancient alcohol. The history of Ryukyu whiskies began with the desire to create a spirit that combined the know-how of ancient rice distillation with the tradition of aging whisky in bourbon barrels instead of the traditional earthen jars used for Awamori. In ancient times, the people of Ryukyu crafted Awamori and presented the spirit to the royal court. In more recent times, barrel-aged spirits distilled from rice became popular among the American soldiers stationed in Okinawa.
